SUMMARY

Dr. Minton, a native of Massachusetts, graduated from Boston University School of Medicine and trained in Internal Medicine at the Beth Israel Hospital, V.A. Hospital, and Tufts-New England Medical Center, all in Boston. His Cardiology training was at the University of Colorado, Denver. He was a Senior Cardiologist with Maine Cardiology Associates, Portland from 1967 to 2002, practicing general, invasive, acute care and preventive cardiology and currently serves on the Active Courtesy Staff, Division of Cardiology at the Maine Medical Center. He is certified in Internal Medicine and in Cardiovascular Disease, is a Fellow of the American College of Physicians, a Fellow of the American College of Cardiology and served as Governor for Maine of the American College of Cardiology between 1977 and 1980. He currently participates in the requirements for Maintenance of Certification by The American Board of Internal Medicine in Cardiovascular Disease. In 1999 Dr. Minton was awarded the Distinguished Service Award by the Northern New England Tri-State Chapter of the American College of Cardiology.

In post graduate medical education, Dr. Minton has lectured widely on subjects including: cardiac diagnosis for physicians in training, strategies in management of coronary heart disease and acute myocardial infarction, congenital heart disease in the adult, heart disease in women, diagnosis and management of cholesterol disorders and the role of beta blockers and calcium channel blockers in cardiovascular disease management.

For ten years he volunteered as Staff Cardiologist and Internist at the Senior Friendship Centers Clinic, Sarasota, Florida. Currently Dr. Minton practices halftime as a physician at a men's clinic in Sandy Springs, GA.

Dr. Minton has been a consultant in forensic cardiology to the legal profession for over 30 years. His special interest is the impact of personal injury and psychosocial and work stress on the heart, and as factors in sudden death. He has active medical licenses in Georgia and in Maine

His educational interests are: preventive cardiology; practical anatomy of the heart; cholesterol disorders; endothelial dysfunction; congenital heart disease in the adult; cardiac diagnosis for student and resident physicians; and non-pharmaceutical approaches to wellness.
