As requests for special design work and facility evaluations by various agencies, contractors, designing engineers and architects increased, Rich developed Aquatic Commercial Consulting (ACC) in 1992. Since then, ACC has consulted on hundreds of public, institutional, commercial and high-end residential pool and water park facilities throughout the nation and abroad.

Prior to 1983, as an aquatic director and manager, Rich operated several public and commercial facilities with both programming and maintenance responsibilities. Since then, he has continued to consult for public, municipal and commercial aquatic facilities on community aquatic need assessments, aquatic program evaluation and development.

In addition, Rich worked as a sales, installation and service technician for pool mechanical systems and works as a mechanical equipment supplier and is a licensed contractor in several states.
